

Bertil Odén is an independent writer, lecturer and consultant. He has worked for Sida, been deputy secretary to the Swedish Parliamentary Commission on development cooperation, head of secretariat to the Expert Group of Development Issues, Ministry for Foreign Affairs and advisor to the Ministry of Planning in Mozambique and the Ministry of Finance in Tanzania. Between 1988 and 1997 he conducted a research program on Southern Africa at NAI.

He has published, edited and contributed to academic literature as well as popular books on development issues, Africa, in particular on regional cooperation and the role of South Africa in southern Africa. He has also written numerous articles and book reviews in daily press, magazines and academic journals.
